





Taiyaki are a pancake-like confectionary shaped like fish, and are popular throughout Japan. They contain a variety of fillings, including azuki red bean jam and custard, chocolate, etc. Niman-ou is a taiyaki store located close to Hanshin Amagasaki Station, that sells taiyaki that are famous for being slightly crunchy on the outside, and soft and chewy in the center. On weekends and holidays they sell up to 5000 taiyaki per day. Along with traditional red bean jam taiyaki (¥70), custard taiyaki (¥90) are also popular. Due to their cheap price, customers often buy large amounts to

Ogura Shouten — located within the shopping street — has been run by a husband and wife team for more than 56 years. They use cast iron molds to cook each taiyaki (¥100) individually, using a traditional style known as "iccho-yaki". The combination of red bean jam paste and fragrant casing creates a truly delicious flavor. Why not munch on one while taking a strol through Amagasaki?





1) Amagasaki Boat Races MAP 3

The Amagasaki Boat Races are a form of public gambling in Japan, and consist of 6 boats performing 3 laps per race. You can choose to bet on who will be the winner, or who will come 1st, 2nd and 3rd for even higher dividends. Bets are placed in units of ¥100, and all you have to do is select your favorites on a betting card. There are 12 races per day, and demonstration races are performed beforehand, allowing you to try and pick out the strongest contestants from the way they handle their boats and the roar of their engines. The races are managed by the cities of Amagasaki and Itami, with all proceeds going towards public projects. There are also locally run food stalls within the area, selling a variety of tasty treats.

Kazuo Shiraga (1924-2008) was known as a daring artist who used an unusual technique of hanging his body from ropes suspended from the ceiling and painting with his feet on canvases on the floor. He was a core member of the Gutai Group, which led the avant-garde art movement in postwar Japan. He is renowned throughout the world for his works, which also hang in the Centre Georges Pompidou in France. His painting style, which is said to have been influenced by the majestic style of the festivals held at the Kifune shrine in Amagasaki (see p.12), is rooted in his deep love for Amagasaki. This has led to him gifting many of his works to the city of Amagasaki. 4 Teramachi MAP 1 B-3

Amagasaki castle was built in 1617 by the feudal lord Ujikane Toda, to protect the western side of Osaka castle. Teramachi (literally "temple town") began as a way to provide services for the town around the castle, by collecting all of the temples scattered around the castle in one place. 11 temples are situated in a space of just 3.9 hectares. Starting with structures that have remained in place for more than 400 years, such as Jouon-ji temple's pagoda (photo far left), more than 7 buildings in the area have been designated as Important Cultural Properties of Japan. The width of the roads and the blocks of lands remain almost the same as they were hundreds of years ago, allowing visitors to truly experience the atmosphere of a castle town. If you have time, why not take a stroll through the

5 World Moneybox Museum MAP 1 B-3


The World Moneybox Museum is run by the Amagasaki Shinkin Bank, and houses a collection of moneyboxes from around the world. The museum building itself was completed in the 1930s, and was originally the second bank building, still containing the original bank vault. The building has been featured on a number of TV shows, and was originally opened as a museum in 1984, featuring 600 items that were collected by an employee. Currently it houses over 13000 items from 62 countries around the world, and continues to expand its collection
















Taste the flavors of the market



2 Chuo-Sanwa Shotengai **shopping** streets

Just west of Hanshin Amagasaki station is Japan's largest shopping street, featuring over 400 stores. It's an area known by the locals for its bargains, featuring a variety of pharmacies, confectionary stores, and 100 yen stores. The area is connected by arcades, making it ideal for shopping on rainy days, but be sure to take a look at the ceilings as well as the stores. They feature a variety of photo opportunities, including paintings of the seven gods of good luck by manga artist Sobe Amako, as well as mascot characters cheering on a local professional baseball team. The street also features video game arcades, and theatres.

This designer sento features a stylish black exterior that really stands out. The interior makes extensive use of wood to create a relaxing atmosphere, and the baths are simple and clean. The owner, Satomi Ina, says that her goal was to create a sento unlike anywhere else in the world. Its number one feature is its hot spring water that is piped up from 700 meters underground. A variety of beauty products are also on offer, including Riento spa cream (¥2000), and "Otome no Agari-yu" skin toner (¥500). You're sure to come out with beautiful, soft skin.

Built in 1923, Daiichi Shikishima-yu has a rich history. Upon entering you are greeted by Mrs. Isako Kuroki, who has been working at there for more than half a century. The baths themselves are small, but quiet, and you can enjoy gazing upon the tile mosaics on the walls, and relax to the scent of the bath salts, which are changed according to season. Why not try one of the relaxing retro massage machines after your bath?








A course on sento:

How to become



- Tie up long hair so it doesn't enter the bath
- Do not wear towels inside the bath
- Ensure not to splash people nearby when washing your body
- Return all bathing goods and stools to their original places upon finishing
- Dry your body before entering the changing area to ensure the floor doesn't get wet

If you follow all these rules, you too will be a master of the sento! Towels, soap, and shampoo are also available for rent.

A festival to pray to Ebisu, the god of prosperity



The first thing you'll notice about Amagasaki Ebisu Shrine is its gigantic 22-meter tall torii gate. In January, storeowners and businessmen from all around Amagasaki come to the shrine for the Toka Ebisu festival, in order to pray for success in business in the New Year. One custom is to purchase decorative stalks of bamboo, which are placed in one's home or workplace, and exchanged at the following years' festival. There is also a custom where money is stuck to a frozen tuna, with the hope that "Money will stick to you as skin sticks to your body".

2 Kifune Shrine Summer Festival MAP 1 B-2

Traditional Japanese portable shrines known as "danjiri" are owned by each town in Amagasaki, and passed down from generation to generation. They are taken to Kifune shrine once every summer for the summer festival. This festival is most famous for its shrine fights known as "Yama-awase", which attract hundreds of spectators every year. For the first two days the shrines are marched around their respective towns, with Yama-awase held on the 2nd of August. The nighttime stalls at the festival are another sight to behold.

3 Kuise Kumano Mikoshi MAP 4

The god of Kuise Kumano Shrine is paraded around the local area for those who are unable to come to the shrine to pray. The god itself is placed on a frame known as a mikoshi. The shrine asks for volunteers every year for this event, with the chief priest Mr. Nakanishi saying that "I hope that people from all over the world can carry the shrine even for a short while to receive some of the god's power."

As well as the "Large mikoshi" weighing approximately 1 ton, there is also a "Woman mikoshi" and a "Child mikoshi" to ensure that anyone can participate in this unusual festival
